Winter Sickness Bug



We have had a high number of children off school with a nasty winter vomiting bug. The school has sought advice from the borough and we are putting getting in additional hygiene products for the toilet areas in particular, as bugs like these spread very quickly. All classes have had a talk about the importance of washing and drying their hands thoroughly. **Please can you talk to your children about how important this is.** If your child has vomited, the borough advice is that they should remain off for 48 hrs so as not to contaminate others.
