Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>Trained up a HLTA for sports sessions from within existing staff body who has transformed the attitude and performance of children in the school. She does her own Karate training outside of school and she has brought that disciplined approach to her teaching &amp; coaching of all sports in the school.</p> <p>Provision of 5 day week 39 week a year after school club has allowed more children to take part in clubs that were previously invite only and running for approximately half of the time.</p> <p>Over the last two years we have developed a relationship with Canning Town Cricket club to open up this sport to our community – it is a new sport to a lot of our community.</p> <p>Achieved 2 consecutive Platinum Marks 2022-24 for participation in sports after Gold awards prior.</p> <p>Moved swimming classes to intensive 2 week long courses at Olympic Pool after poor teaching at previous venue</p> <p>Long-standing relationship with Bikeability charity to give bike riding lessons to Y4,5&amp;6 every year</p> <p>Y5/6 Girls borough football Champions 2024</p> <p>Y5/6 Boys Runners-up 2024</p> <p>Numerous other top 3 finishes in official borough competitions 2023-24</p> <p>£15K of a grant from DFE to be used to half the cost of clubs so all can attend if so wish.</p>	<p>Platinum achievement last 2 years will be consolidated into continual top level/Platinum awards for sports participation more years.</p> <p>School needs to integrate a 10 mins aerobic slot for all children at beginning of the day – this will help to enhance readiness for learning and thus attainment.</p>
