

Trained up a HLTA for sports sessions from within existing staff body who has transformed the attitude and performance of children in the school. She does her own Karate training outside of school and she has brought that disciplined approach to her teaching & coaching of all sports in the school.

School needs to integrate a 10 mins aerobic slot for all children at beginning of the day – this will help to enhance readiness for learning and thus attainment.
